to the Research Conference on the Single Market

As I said in Prague, the Single Market is our core business.

The Single Market is our most important asset.

As the former two-time EU Commissioner, French Minister of Foreign Affairs, and Brexit chief negotiator, Michel Barnier, has declared recently: "the only reason why President Joe Biden and President Xi Jinping respect us is the Single Market".

Despite this political relevance, however, the European internal market seems to have been somehow neglected by economic scholars, at least after its establishment.

We are here, today, to fill that gap!

We want to bring together the most relevant works and develop a well-organized body of academic research on this topic.

Today we will look at the internal and the external dimensions of the Single Market, by discussing options for its future and the relation with other major economies, in particular the United States.

We will learn about the economic impact of the Single Market and its accountability vis-à-vis our citizens; we will get insights about financial integration, risk sharing and foreign direct investment.

Our speakers will tell us about the evolving landscape of supply chains, and the home bias in the procurement market; they will explain how to design carbon pricing mechanisms, and if there is a business case for the green transition.

As you can see, we have a very rich and interesting programme.

The goal of this conference is twofold:

On the one side, we want to inform policymakers, and this is an important year to do so...

On the other side, we also want to steer future academic research on the matter.

I encourage you to actively engage in the discussions, ask questions, and share your expertise.

The success of this conference hinges on our collective ability to exchange ideas and contribute to the ongoing debates.
