Our role in ending animal testing: We want Europe to lead



We fully support Europe's ambitions to replace animal testing



Committed EPAA member



Partnerships to optimise awareness



Support OECD to assess chemical hazards without animal testing



Invested 4 million in alternative testing research over past 15 years

Despite reliable non-animal alternative methods being on the rise:

- There continues to be a lack of regulatory acceptance
- Already an estimated 2.6 million animals have been used for REACH since 2007
- New CSS information requirements could lead to at least 4 million more animals used in the EU, according to Cruelty Free Europe



Our industry's transition – NAMs are a key component





- Integrate societal expectations
- Acknowledge new scientific developments in safety assessment
- We need to **completely rethink** our approach to hazard and safety assessment



A faster and more efficient model to accelerate innovation

Moving forward: Co-designing a roadmap



- Short term: Greater efforts to accelerate the regulatory uptake of NAMs <u>TODAY</u> any amendment to REACH and CLP is an opportunity to reflect new science in alternative methods.
- Long-term: a roadmap to transition to a new system, for better, faster and humanrelevant safety assessment, which leads to replacing animal testing with reliable and timely safety and hazard assessments. Outlined with timing + specific actions.

Beyond this, we need:



Leadership from EU policy makers



Modernise safety assessment to optimise testing: run animal testing only when it makes sense and there is no alternative. REACH and CLP will have to be further revised (in due course).



A clear plan to fund NAMs - Commission and Member State level



Cooperate with other regions globally - towards the development and validation of NAMs + regulatory changes (UN and OECD)
